Dr. Stefan Parent, MD, PhD, is a Pediatric Orthopedic Surgeon and a Clinician-Scientist with a focus on spinal deformities. He holds several grants in the fields of scoliosis progression, growth modulation of the spine and chest cage and in the development of various other animal models. He recently established a Pediatric Orthopedic Experimental Surgery Laboratory at the CHU Sainte-Justine. This laboratory was specifically created to develop animal models of growth modulation of the spine.

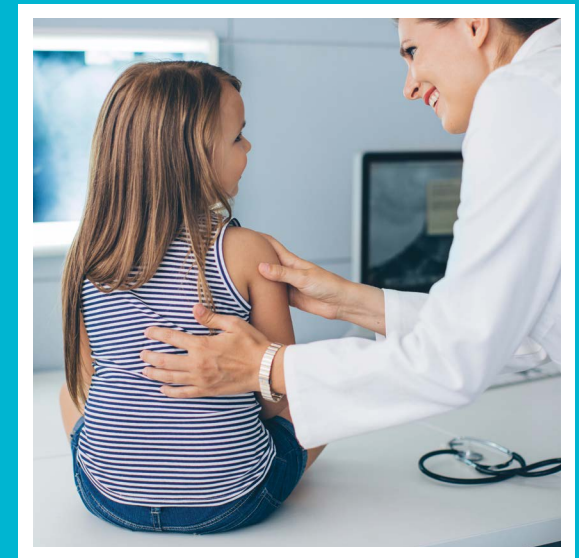

- Topic: “Prediction of scoliosis progression based on 3D parameters at the first visit” and “Vertebral body tethering for the treatment of early and rapidly progressive AIS” with Q&A Session
- Dr. Parent’s topics will discuss the current 2-dimensional imaging studies being used to fix a 3-dimensional disorder (scoliosis). The 2-dimensional classification does not account for the amount of rotation present but the 3-dimensional model will develop a classification system for adolescent idiopathic scoliosis. If physicians know the degree of rotation, they can make a more accurate prognosis of whether a scoliosis will progress or remain unchanged. This technology will be a very welcomed tool for predicting whether or not to recommend spinal fusion surgery in adolescence to halt the progression of their scoliosis.

- The field of hip preservation is relatively young, but knowledge and research in this area is increasing rapidly. Gaps in knowledge remain about absolute indications surgery, which methods of preservation should be adopted in specific conditions, and how effective these methods are long term. As long term outcome data becomes more available these gaps in knowledge are improving and allowing orthopedic surgeons to revise their indications and use the most appropriate methods for hip preservation.
