Purpose

With over 1.3 million adults in the United States alone, adult congenital heart disease (ACHD) has become a local and global health issue. In its 27th year, the International Symposium on Adult Congenital Heart Disease brings experts from around the world to deliver the latest findings of cutting-edge research as well as practical advice for the treatment of these patients. This meeting offers opportunities for the novice to the ACHD specialist to learn, share strategies and build relationships — with the ultimate goal of improving the lives of adults with congenital heart disease.

- Improve the effectiveness of cardiovascular team-based care
