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Description

Under the directorship of conference chair, William Balistreri, MD, Pediatric Gastrointestinal Disease and Small Bowel Transplantation is the 39th in a series of annual “Aspen-Snowmass” conferences. Our previous conferences have been well-attended, highly regarded and widely lauded. A renowned faculty has been invited to participate.

Accommodations

Getting to Aspen/Snowmass

Aspen-Pitkin County Airport/Sardy Field (ASE) is approximately 7 miles from Snowmass Village and 4 miles from the Aspen business district. The airport is served by United Airlines and American Airlines regional jets. Complimentary ground transportation to and from the airport is offered to attendees staying at the Viceroy Snowmass hotel. Transportation can also be arranged for attendees staying at a condominium.
