CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

Welcome to the 3rd annual conference, "Family Centered Approach for Children of Addicted Parents," presented by the Collaborative for Children of Addicted Parents, GLAD House, and Cincinnati Children's. This year's conference will focus on medical and neurodevelopmental issues, childcare, preschool and school issues, family placement, protective services and court involvement, and prevention measures through a family centered approach. Through these discussions, we hope as a community to support the family structure (biological or other) for every child affected by parental addiction, thereby, halting the intergenerational cycle of addiction.
