TARGET AUDIENCE

This Summit is designed for physicians, nurse practitioners, nurses, social workers, and other perinatal health professionals providing services to pregnant women and their families

PURPOSE

The purpose of this meeting is to bring together clinical and public health leaders to review and discuss current perinatal issues, data, and ideas that can be addressed to improve pregnancy outcomes within the region.

OBJECTIVES

- Describe the complex ethically challenging issues to be considered when determining the clinical course of an anticipated or inevitable periviable birth
- Identify maternal outcomes associated with the delivery of a periviable infant or the decision not to intervene
- Discuss periviable infant outcomes as documented by data and as perceived by the media/parental perspectives and the subsequent importance of shared decision making
