Course Description:

This course will provide evidence based principles within the pediatric and adolescent population in the specialty areas of fluency, cognitive rehabilitation and mental health. Therapists will be given information related to: therapeutic presence; use of counseling and support of health literacy for patient and family comprehension of diagnosis, treatment, goals and therapy strategies; as well as informed care and narrative language skills in education of the patient, family and treatment team related to trauma in mental health.

Learner Outcomes:

Upon completion of this seminar, the participants will be able to:

- Define therapeutic presence and health literacy
- List 3 factors which impact successful collaboration between SLP, patient, and caregiver
- Discuss the importance of narrative formulation in trauma based therapy
- Discuss how patients with fluency, brain injury, or mental health diagnoses would benefit from therapeutic presence during therapy sessions

Stephanie has lectured on a variety of topics related to ABI and cognitive rehabilitation for the adult and pediatric population at the local, state, and national level.

Her area of interest and expertise is working with children and families impacted by emotional and behavioral disorders.
