# 37th Annual Aspen Conference on Pediatric Gastrointestinal Disease: Pediatric Gastrointestinal Disease and Small Bowel Transplantation

## Description

Under the directorship of conference chair, William Balistreri, MD, *Pediatric Gastrointestinal Disease and Small Bowel Transplantation* is the 37th in a series of annual "Aspen-Snowmass" conferences. Our previous conferences have been well-attended, highly regarded and widely lauded. A renowned faculty has been invited to participate.

The conference will focus on recent advances in the diagnosis and management of children with a wide variety of gastrointestinal diseases. Topics include:

The conference format includes didactic lectures and case presentations held each morning; there is ample time for discussion and audience participation.

The conference is designed primarily for pediatric gastroenterologists and hepatologists, but is of interest to pediatric and transplant surgeons, nurse coordinators, nutritionists, pathologists and pediatricians as well.

### Cancellation Policy


