The conference provides a unique opportunity for participants to obtain mentorship from an elite group of faculty to strengthen their scholarship skills in an area of academic focus (e.g., clinical research, quality improvement, or educational scholarship). Our goal is for participants to create communities of practice so they can continue to learn from each other outside of the conference, including opportunities for post-conference virtual check-ins.



The conference is intended for adult and pediatric hospitalists; however, all specialists are welcome to attend as the content is broadly applicable across fields.



The faculty is world-renowned and has been recruited from Cincinnati Children's and several other institutions. The intimate conference atmosphere ensures that attendees will be able to interact with these faculty members and each other throughout the weekend.

Clinical Services
